

Growing the Legacy of a Strong Sisterhood, Brave Enough to Be the Light!

Greetings,

During this Pandemic, we have been blessed. Kamala Harris was elected the first female and first African American Vice President of the United States and the nomination and confirmation of Supreme Court Justice Ketanji Brown-Jackson.

It has taken 232 years and 115 prior appointments for a Black woman to be selected to serve on the Supreme Court of the United States, but we've made it," she said. I was most proud when Justice Ketanji Brown Jackson quoted the excerpt from Phenomenal Woman, by Dr. Maya Angelou, "...Bringing the gifts that my ancestors gave. I am the dream and the hope of

the slave...". I wanted her to continue with, "I Rise" to emphasize her confirmed role as SUPREME COURT JUSTICE! and then I wanted her to end with "I AM A WOMAN, PHENOMENALLY! PHENOMENAL WOMAN...THAT'S ME!"

With these ladies, we stand in solidarity with them. We have a Sisterhood with them, and we don't know either of them personally. We know and they know Sisters got their back! You see these ladies are Brave enough to be the Light! Are you brave enough to be the Light? I hear many of us even myself saying, "I'm tired". And that's okay, as long as you don't give up. My Sorors, my beautiful Sisters, we must be like Nehemiah as he was building the wall, say to yourself, I'm doing a great work, I can't come down. Our work is too great. The world wants to impose policy and law to curtail the teaching of the truth in our history. They call it Critical Race Theory. Therefore, we must teach our young people as we did in the seventies and eighties, I'm Black and I'm Proud! You're Young, Gifted, and Black!

It's imperative you continue the Blueprint given by our illustrious Founders. Y.E.S. They gave us the Light! Say Yes to Youth! Say Yes to Education! Say Yes to Service! Find ways outside of the classroom to teach our history to our Youth. Take it to our homes, to the Recreation Centers, to our churches and take it to Zoom. Partner with companies to sponsor chapter events. Brand your chapter by emailing letters asking for sponsorships. Include brief video links of your Xinos/Kudos performances especially oratorical. Include flyers of past Teach-A-Rama activities. During your follow up call, give your Elevator Speech. NSPDK holds the key to improving our communities and decreasing learning loss. We are the Light!

After two years of disruption and difficult working conditions, the education profession is in the midst of a crisis of morale, leading to growing concerns about burnout and attrition among both teachers and school leaders. We must explore the critical question of how this dire trajectory can be reversed. What viable steps can school communities, education leaders, and policymakers take to improve educators' working conditions, job satisfaction, and professional status? We are Brave Enough to be the Light and sit at the table to discuss How schools can better support a new generation of teachers and leaders and create more attractive career paths in the wake of the pandemic? Strategies for improving recruitment and retention of educators of color must be a focus. Ask your leadership if teachers can serve on the committee to hire the best teachers. Teachers that identify with the culture of the school. Share our National and Regional Publications as well as our Eastern Region Call to Action with Superintendents, City Officials, and Legislators. We are Brave Enough to be the Light. Our Ancestors gave us this Light!

I see the Strength of Sisterhood everyday as I serve as Regional Director. To engage with my Sorors to plan our meetings and conferences and then execute the plan with professionalism. I stand in awe of you, my sisters. To know when to be a leader and when to be a follower. You are beyond the chatter. You are That Queen sitting at the table and making decisions to move children forward. We are the Profession that Creates all Other Professions. During Chapter, Regional, National Meetings and events dress in business attire, in NSPDK Inc sororal colors. Do not wear other sorority or other organization's paraphernalia to our meetings.

Proper Protocol involves knowing your Chapter Charter members. Treat them with reverence and respect. 
