Sorority Tidbits

Take From the Table

The object of the motion to Take from the Table is to make pending again before the assembly a motion that has been laid on the table.

Example:

Mr. President, I move to take the motion that the chapter have a "Winter Gala" on December 28 for Phidelka Foundation off the table.

The motion to Take from the Table:

- Take precedence over no pending motion, and therefore cannot be moved while any other question is pending.
- Requires a second.
- Not amendable.
- Not debatable.
- Requires a majority vote.
- Cannot interrupt another speaker.
- Cannot be reconsidered.
- A motion taken from the table becomes the immediate pending business.
- A motion laid on the table dies if not taken from the table during that session, or the next session if that session occurs within a quarterly time interval.
- ➤ When a motion is taken from the table, it is exactly as it was when laid on the table with everything adhering to it. Except, if a motion to postpone were adhering and the time to postpone has past, then the motion is ignored.

If the motion is taken up on the same day:

- Members who have exhausted their right of debate cannot speak further.
- > Previous question or limitation or extension of debate is not exhausted.

However, if taken up on another day:

- Members right of debate is renewed.
- > Previous question is exhausted and regular rules of debate prevail.

LENTILS

What's So Good About Lentils and Not Split Peas?

It can reduce the risk of colon cancer, high cholesterol, heart disease, diabetes and prevents constipation. Due to the potassium level, its benefits are lowering the sodium (salt) and lowers blood pressure. In addition, lentils assist with serotonin that makes you feel good, focus and calmness.

RECIPE

- 1 cup of uncooked lentils (Black the healthiest) NOT SPLIT PEA in a large mason jar
- 1 tsp Paprika (regular or smoke)
- ½- tsp Garam Masala seasoning (to taste)
- 2-3 cloves of garlic
- 1 shallot
- 4-5 leaves of fresh Basil
- 1 Bay leaf
- 2 tbs of tomatoes paste (comes in tube or small can)

Black pepper and sea salt to taste (sea salt has less sodium/salt)

Read your labels

- 3 tbs Extra Virgin Olive Oil (less processed than light)
- 2-3 cups of vegetable broth/ or water (your choice of consistency)

Soak lentils in large mason jar for a few hours or no soak. They cook fast. Use stove pot, stove pressure cooker, Insta Pot or Ninja. Add all ingredients and stir a little. Cook as instructed for pressure cookers. Stove pot cook for about 20-30 minutes or until soft. Please watch carefully and don't forget to remove the bay leaf before serving.

SUBJECT: REVISED COVID-19 AND VARIANTS NSPDK, INC., REQUIREMENTS

EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY

Purpose:

The COVID-19 vaccination is a vital tool to reduce the presence and severity of Covid -19 cases in the nation as a whole. Due to the surge in Covid cases, National Sorority of Phi Delta Kappa, Incorporated, Board of Trustees (BOT) and the National Executive Council (NEC), have agreed to safeguard all members of our sorority by requiring proof of covid vaccines of members who participate (in person) in activities sponsored by NSPDK. This agreement complies with OSHA's (Occupational Safety & Health Administration) Emergency Temporary Standard and Vaccination and Testing.

Further, COVID-19 most commonly spreads between people who are in close contact through respiratory droplets or small particles produced when an infected person coughs, talks, or breathes. Growing evidence shows that droplets can remain suspended in the air and travel distances beyond six feet, according to the Center for Disease Control (CDC). In support of further prevention and healthy practices, NSPDK, Inc., BOT and NEC, require active use of the bulleted items below.

<u>Required Practices</u> - All Sorors, Xinos, Kudos, KOTs, Sponsors, Hub Parents, and Anthropos attending any NSPDK, Inc., in person meeting and or event, must:

- Provide a copy of your COVID-19 vaccines/booster card; and receive wrist band demonstrating compliance, to be worn throughout conference.
- Receive temperature check upon arrival at Conference site.
- Wear N/KN95 masks at all times, unless eating, public speaking, performances.
- Wash your hands regularly with soap and water, or clean them with alcohol-based hand rub.
- Consistent use of hand sanitizers.
- If asked, or need, see the Nurse on sight. Nurse(s) determined by Regional Directors.
- With students' accommodations, have 2 per room only.
- In the event a student demonstrates COVID-19 symptoms (i.e., fever, chills, coughs, etc.), sponsors should inform the Regional Chairs IMMEDIATELY. Student must be quarantined IMMEDIATELY, to await pick up by parent, authorized guardian, or authorized parent designee.

Exemptions:

- NSPDK, Inc., COVID-19 attached Exemption Form must be completed, for medical/religious exemptions, that are handled on an individual case basis.
- Certified copy of exemption must be provided by medical doctor/religious leader.
