Life Reflections

Marguerite Hubbard-McClelland was born December 6, 1919, in Holly Springs, Mississippi to the union of Brooks Hubbard, Sr. and Minnie Marshall-Hubbard. Her parents, and all of her siblings (Grace, Brooks Jr., Henry Sr., Elroy Sr., Phillip and Felicia) preceded her in death.

She accepted Jesus Christ in her life at an early age.

By 1921, the family moved to Webster Groves, Missouri where she completed her high school education.

She was our “Superstar,” a trailblazer determined to succeed. Bobbie knew education was the key in her strategy for success.

Bobbie worked over 45 years for Detroit’s Public School Educational system. She worked in numerous capacities starting as an art teacher. She advanced to a counselor for the middle and high schools then on to the fine arts department “Head” and finishing in the administration of Public Department Guidance and Counseling. Bobbie received countless degrees in education and she was a Ph.D degree candidate at the University of Michigan. Bobbie also received numerous local, state and professional merits and service awards.

In addition to the previously mentioned accomplishments, Marguerite tirelessly worked with the W.K. Kellogg Foundation National Dialogue for African American Men Conference, National Council of Negro Women, A.I.O.P./Points of Light Foundation Partnership, National Association for Equal Opportunity in Higher Education Conference, N.A.A.C.P. Legal Fund and Educational Fund Awards Dinner for Presidents/Special Guests and Annual Fundraiser Dinner, Dais participant, Ford Motor Co. Telecast, Vision for Year 2000, National Black Family Reunion Telecast, United Negro College Fund Telecast (presented \$4,000), Press conference for 68th and 70th Anniversary Conclave, received Letters of Commendation on behalf of the National Sorority of Phi Delta Kappa, Inc. presented by First Lady Barbara Bush, wife of past United States of America President George Bush funded by the U.S. Office of Education, and Ebony Magazine Awards judging committee. Ebony Magazine also honored her in their 1989, 1990, 1991, 1992 and 1993 issues as “The Most 100 Influential Black Americans.”

On May 26, 1950, Bobbie became a member of “Alpha Rho Omega” chapter of “Alpha Kappa Alpha” Sorority, Inc. During her 68 year journey, she faithfully served her “Beloved Sorority”, at many levels. Some memorable positions: locally—Basileus, Regionally—Midwestern Region Member at Large (many times), Midwestern Regional Director and Nationally—First Supreme Anti—Basileus and Trustee—National Sorority of Phi Delta Kappa, Inc.

Early Monday morning, May 7, 2018, Bobbie peacefully transitioned to her new home to be with her Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. She leaves to cherish her memory: her sister-in-law ~ Larcenia Hubbard; her nieces ~ Sharon Hubbard, Marsha Massey, Leandra (Ed) Henderson, Joycelyn Jones, Jacqueline Hubbard and Patricia Andujo. Her nephews ~ Willam L. Hubbard, Michael S. Hubbard, Sr., and Roy C. Hubbard (Oakland, CA.). Her cousins ~ Vicki, Kathi, Judy, Cheryl, Keric; a host of grandnieces and grand-nephews, her close friend, Soror Harriet Crouch, among countless sorors, sorority sisters and friends.
