

Parliamentarian's Corner

Sorority Tidbits

Remember! Newley Elected Officers

In those chapters where elections are not staggered, the term of office may be either two or four years---with the option of officers serving a second term. In no case, will an elected Soror serve more than four consecutive years in the same office (Exception, an officer who fills an unexpired term may run in her own right).

- Installation of officers shall be the last item of business at the June meeting of election year.
- All materials shall be transferred to new officers not later than August 1 of election year.
- The incoming officer shall become familiar with the Chapter's Bylaws, the National Constitution and Bylaws, the Manual of Policies and Procedures, the Regional Bylaws, and the Chapter's Standing Rules. She shall become familiar with accepted precedence, the unwritten laws and practices of the Sorority. She shall obtain Robert's Rules of Order, Newley Revised, the accepted Parliamentary Authority and other reference books as the occasion demands. (Please review, Section XI Page 10, Officer Protocol).






Greeting Sorors,







